WAR MEMORIAL

"All gave some but some gave all"

James Robert Couch

SFC -E7- Army, 46 years old, born on September 13, 1922 killed in action on July 20, 1969. He was killed in Thua Thien, South Vietnam. Died illness/injury Air Loss, Crash Land Helicopter.

Walter Anthony Cicchiani

Navy Corpsman with 3rd Marine, U. S. Navy. Born on January 4, 1947 killed in action on April 30, 1968. His rank was Petty Officer and his honors are: Purple Heart, National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Service Medal and Republic Of Vietnam Campaign Ribbon Bar. He died from hostile artillery, rocket, mortar ground casualty in Quang Tri South Vietnam.

Sgt. Thomas Tomko

Sgt. Thomas A. "Nick" Tomko 24 of McKees Rocks formerly from Hampton Township and Butler, died Sunday in Iraq in military service to his country.

A 1997 graduate of Hampton High School, he was a sergeant in the New Kensington 307th Military Police Co., Army Reserves.

CPL. THOMAS CZZOWITZ

Cpl. E4 Czzowitz was born on August 19, 1942 and died on September 9, 1965 in Quang Nam, South Vietnam. Hostile death from gun, small arms fire and a ground casualty.

RICHARD DENNIS COYLE

Pfc. Coyle was born on February 28, 1949 and killed in action on March 6, 1969 in Quang Nam, South Vietnam. He died from artillery, rocket and mortar attacks.

RONALD E GERWIG

Born December 10, 1944 and died August 18, 1966 in Quang Tri, South Vietnam. He was in the US Marine Corps Selective Service and was a LCPL E3. He died from artillery, rocket and mortar attacks.

ADAMS WAR MEMORIAL SERVICE May 20, 2018 at 2:00 P.M.

You are cordially invited to attend the Adams War Memorial Service in the Adams Township Park.

Mr. John Yeager is the Master of Ceremonies and Rev. Peter DeVries will do the invocation and benediction.

Ken Carlson a Vietnam Veteran will be the speaker. He served 26 years with the FBI and 15 years with the CIA.

The Bantam Marines Detachment #743 will post the colors and retire them. They will also do the gun salute and the playing of the taps. This group of Veterans is known for their "Toys for Tots" campaign in Butler and they also do many memorial services.

The Cranberry Barbershop Chorus, will sing the National Anthem and the Armed Forces Medley. Also, the laying of wreaths will be laid by two of the Veteran's family whose name appears on the monument.

We need to remember the importance of Memorial Day. Our purpose in having this ceremony is to salute our Veterans. We want to remind everyone of all ages what our Veterans go through in order to give us Freedom.

If you have never attended these services, you will find they are heartfelt and patriotic.



TOWNSHIP HIGHLIGHTS

ADAMS TOWNSHIP MEDICATION DROP BOX

The Adams Township Police Department has a Drug Drop Box designed to significantly reduce the prescription drugs in American homes that are either no longer needed or outdated. These same drugs have unfortunately become the target of theft and misuse, oftentimes by people who have access to the residence. More and more adults recognize the need to remove these substances from the home, and legally and safely turn them over to law enforcement for proper destruction.

The drop box is located in the lobby of the main floor of the Adams Township Municipal Building located at 690 Valencia Road, Mars, PA 16046. Residents can drop off unwanted medications Monday - Friday 7:30 A.M.– 4:00 P.M.

Items that **are permitted** in the drug box are prescription medications, prescription patches, prescription ointments, over the counter medications, vitamins, samples, and medications for pets.

Items **NOT** permitted in the drug box are needles (sharps), thermometers, hydrogen peroxide, inhalers, aerosol cans, ointments, lotions and liquids.

We recommend anyone dropping off medications to scratch off or remove personal information from the bottles.

NEVER FLUSH medications. **DO NOT POUR** them down a sink or drain.

DOG ENFORCEMENT OFFICER

Dennis B. Sybert is The Dog Law Enforcement Officer for Adams Township and is responsible for the investigation and enforcement of the Pennsylvania Dog Laws. Please contact Dennis B. Sybert at 724-352-4732 with any dog complaints or concerns.

LICENSE YOUR DOG IN PA

All dogs three months or older must be licensed by Jan. 1st of each year. Violators can be cited with a maximum fine of \$300 per violation plus court costs.

An annual license is \$8.50 and a lifetime license is \$51.50. If the animal is spayed or neutered, the annual fee is \$6.50 and lifetime is \$31.50. Discounts are available to older adults and people with disabilities. The small license fee helps the millions of dogs in the state by funding the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture Bureau of Dog Law Enforcement.

Dog licenses are available from your local county treasurer and other licensing agents.

 assume drivers will stop.




Obey all Traffic Laws & Lights
